

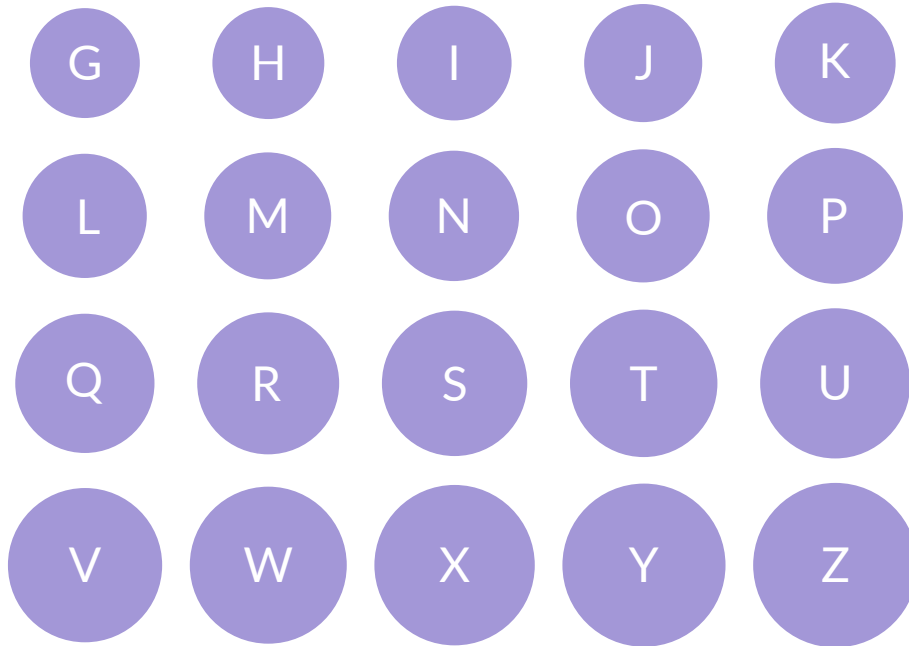

Ring Size Guide

Before printing out this guide on A4 paper, ensure that you have your printer set to 100% and not fit to scale, fit to page or printable area.

HOW TO MEASURE A RING YOU ALREADY OWN

Place your own ring over a circle to find one that matches up to the inside of your own ring.

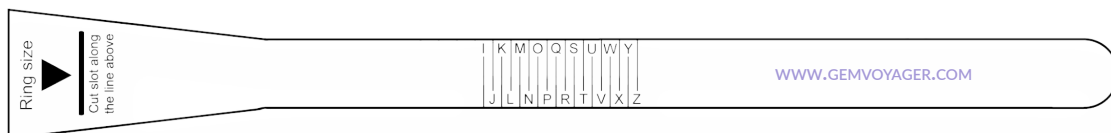


MEASURE YOUR FINGER TO FIND YOUR RING SIZE

Cut the sizer out as close to the outline as possible.

Make a small incision where indicated in the large end of the measure.
Wrap the sizer around your finger and carefully slide the rounded end into the slot.

Pull the sizer gently around your finger. Don't pull too hard or the paper will rip. Move the sizer over the knuckle to ensure you can take the sizer on and off. Once you are comfortable with the size, read the letter the arrow is pointing at. The letter is your ring size.



Note:

This is only a GUIDE. Often shanks that are thicker will require a larger ring size and shanks that are tapered, thin or raised may require a smaller size.

Most rings can be resized, however resizing eternity bands is not recommended.
